Preference will be given to student pursuing a career as a Commercial Transport Technician, Heavy Duty Technician, Commercial Vehicle Driver (Class 1), or Autobody Technician/Refinisher.

Criteria

Students applying for this scholarship are asked to submit a video and/or 500-word essay outlining their short-term goals and how this scholarship will help them achieve their long-term goals to accompany the application. Successful candidates will anticipate serving the community of the Kootenays pursuing a career in the Commercial Transportation field.

Applicants must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents (landed immigrants) residing in SD8 Kootenay Lake, and must fulfill the BC Graduation requirements by August 31st of the student's graduating year.
